The Caroga Lake region has experienced an increase of invasive pests including knotweed, phragmites (reed grass) Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, Emerald Ash Borer and other problematic species that can crowd our native plants and damage area property, trees, and plant life.

The Canada Lakes Conservation Association invites the public to this educational session on how to identify, report, prevent and manage terrestrial invasive species infestations in our area.
